Commonwealth Human Rights Initiative (CHRI) takes great pleasure in inviting you to the launch of the Virtual Police Station (VPS) project on 17th November 2015 at New Delhi's India Habitat Centre, Gulmohar Hall, Lodhi Road, at 10:30am (registration begins at 10:00am)

The VPS is a first of its kind training tool developed with the cooperation of the Rajasthan Police that allows the police, civil society and public to enter a police station virtually to explore every room in 360 degrees and interact with the many people and objects you would find in an actual police station. Using videos, text boxes and key resources, a user can learn the many processes and procedures that are performed everyday such as arrest, registering a case of sexual assault, witness interviews, interrogation, storing of case property, handling cases involving juveniles, and more.

This groundbreaking multi-language program works both online and offline, is completely integrated to social media, and has been called the "next generation of police training" by several high-ranking officers such as former DGP Omendra Bharadwaj (Rajasthan) and described as "an invaluable resource for cadets" by film maker Vishal Bharadwaj.

The meeting will be attended by serving and retired police personnel, civil society, lawyers, and educators.
