DoPT's Approach Paper on a Privacy Law for India - Send Your Comments by 25th October, 2010 October 21, 2010

Dear friends,

The Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT), Government of India, has released an approach paper on the issue of a law to protect privacy in India inviting comments from people. Readers may recollect that the DoPT had conducted a consultation inviting a handful of researchers and a larger group of bureaucrats (and hardly any RTI users or activists) on this subject in July, 2010. This approach paper appears to be a follow-up of the same meeting.

The approach paper appears to have been uploaded on the DoPT website for public comments on 18th October. They have given the 1.2 billion people of India 'one week' to respond to this paper from this date. The last date for submission of comments is <u>25th October</u>, <u>2010</u> I am almost three days late in alerting you. That leaves us with four days only to read, digest, debate and send comments to the DoPT.
