

## Highlights October 2004

### Feedback

#### ***Dharampura Village-***

Regarding the gambling issue, the Police did take action 2 times but the CLGs told that this is still going on specially by the school students. The CLG members said that the police should continue instructing and pressurizing the gamblers and should take action if they are not obeying them.

#### ***Nakati Village-***

Over the patrolling issue, it is not going on daily, and occurring once in 3-4 days. The CLG members are not satisfied by the Police patrolling and want it daily, although not any fixed time is selected and could take place any time as per their comfortableness.

#### ***Baroda Village-***

Over the demand of Police action and surveillance over the place called 'Bhata', the Police did made some raids there, CLGs were satisfied over the Police action but want continuous police surveillance of the place.

#### ***Maana Basti Village-***

Regarding the tenants and outsider's registration and verification, the Police have given instruction to the Kotwar to give a message to the Villagers by 'haaka'.

Over the demand of 'Police Sahayta Kendra' i.e. Police Help Centre in the Village, the Police officer again told that this can only be finalized by SSP, while the letter regarding this has not yet forwarded by Maana P.S. The CLG still want it however, I told them that as no effective steps have been taken by SSP regarding our previous 3 demands to SSP which we had given in writing recently, so it is of no use to put some others demand unless the previous is fulfilled.

#### ***Bhatgaon Village-***

Regarding the daily Police patrolling issue, it is happening once in 4-5 days, and not daily, the CLG members are not satisfied and want daily Police patrolling.

Over the illegal selling of liquor, the Police have directed the person engaged, and who has stopped selling here since last week. CLG members are satisfied but still want continuous Police surveillance over it.

#### ***Maana Colony Village-***

Regarding the CLGs demand for the Police arrangement during the 'Doorga Pooja', the Beat Officer told that he has intimated this to his SHO of his P.S. Maana, and will be taken care as happened previously. The CLGs were satisfied and asked Beat Officer to recall SHO again.

**Problem raised by CLG Members and Assertion & Commitment made by the Police over these:-**

***Dharampura Village-***

The CLG demands for continuous action over the gambling issue as this could ignite the place as a trend to play gambling and would spoil the student's future. The Police Officers say that they will stop at the hot spot during the police patrolling and will search for gamblers whenever they will visit the Village.

***Nakati Village-***

There should be daily Police patrolling although the time can be fixed by the Police officer as per their comfortableness. The Police officer said that they would do it.

***Maana Basti Village-***

CLGs wants tenants & outsider registration in Village, and to informed in P.S. where the Police will do regular investigation about their whereabouts, The Police said told that they will tell the Kotwar to register these and bring it to P.S. frequently.

***Maana Colony-***

CLGs demanded for Police arrangement during the 'Durga Pooja' starting from 18<sup>th</sup> Oct to 22<sup>nd</sup> Oct, next month. The Police officer told that they had already told the SHO and Police arrangement will be there during this function.

***Doomartarai Village -***

Over the factory emitting pollution issue, no more Police action has been made after the last meeting, although the pollution emission has gone down. Here CLG lodged this complaint to the CGHRC on 25<sup>th</sup> September. The CLG want a complete stop of pollution.

***Boriakalla Village -***

Regarding the Police patrolling, it is going on once in 3-4 days and not daily, where CLGs wants it daily. While regarding the non-effective working of the school in their Village, its working is now improved, as I had told the school supervisor to do something to sort out this problem after previous beat meeting. He had conveyed this message to his colleague Coordinator of Education, who in result ordered the school administration to work sincerely.

**Expectation of the Police from the Community: -**

Police officer said the community should help them by giving the information of crime or any incidence in time. Beat office asked the CLGs to help they should also try to solve the gambling problem through Panchayats or by consensus formation in the Village.

Police Expectation from the Community:- The Community should help Police by becoming the witness if they satisfied by the Police action and should help by giving information regarding crime and suspicious activities & person. Police officer asked the CLGs to made surveillance & effort to stop huge gambling during Diwali.

**Comments:-**

In this meeting again the main problem was roaming around the problem due to ineffective Police Patrolling.

The second problem was the involvement of school going kids in gambling, which is again a serious issue to be checked & solved, and it is highly appreciated that the CLG is taking much interest to solve this issue.

In this meeting I have discussed the 'Police Organization in India' with CLG & Police, but here as most of the CLG were illiterate the no. of questions asked of me were very few and limited. I have also told them that from the onwards upcoming meeting one topic related to Police, Citizens rights, laws or social awareness would be discussed in each meeting

This meeting was attended by almost all the women SHG members under Mrs Urmilla Sahu, who were quite interested in participating in problem solving.

This meeting was attended by two young educated men where one is the son of the titled Shadani sant( of Shadani Darbar in Maana area) named Mr Satyavritt Shadani, and his neighbor .Mr Shayam Chawla who is an stage artist related with IPTA and had also served in playgroups(AGAAS) which worked along " Mumbai Moholla Committee". Mr Chawla.has also worked with Mumbai police to send the message of Communal harmony.
