

## Minutes -Highlights October 2005

### Meeting of T.I. (SHO) with CLG (Community Liaison Group) Members: -

#### Action taken and feedback given by CLG members over the problems raised in last T.I. meeting

*Common Problem: Regarding the action to stop selling 'Jarda' (tobacco with beetle) and Cigarettes near the school - the police told that almost all the Pan shops near the school have been warned (specially the shop's near the school of Village Mana Basti, Mana Camp & Doomartarai) not to sell tobacco to the school going children and if police will again received any complaint then they have to face strong action.*

Feedback by CLG members: CLG members were satisfied with the police action and informed that they will keep checking the Pan Shops and will keep the police informed.

*Regarding the patrolling issue in Banarsi Village -the T.I Mr. Dubey informed since the time they received the small 4-wheeler Gypsy vehicle he has instructed the patrolling party and beat officer to go to Banarsi Village on alternate days.*

Feedback by CLG members: CLG members of Banarsi told that although patrolling has increased since last month but still the police personnel is not patrolling the narrow path called *gullies*.

*Regarding the combined action to stop the sale of illegal liquor in Baroda Village - the T.I informed that continuous surveillance have been made over the accused person but neither they have found any traces of illicit liquor with him nor any complaint have been made to the police regarding it.*

Feedback by CLG members: CLG members of Baroda informed that now the sale of illegal liquor has been stopped and they are satisfied but asked the police to continue the surveillance.

#### *Regarding Mana Basti-*

Regarding the tenants and visitor verification in Mana Basti Village through 'Kotwar', the Police informed that Kotwar has given identification details of some tenants living in the Village and the police are in the process of its verification

Feedback by CLG members: CLG members of Mana Basti Village said that they had also built pressure over Kotwar in the last Beat meeting where the Kotwar had promised the members & police that he will furnish the details of tenants within 15 days to Mana police. They further said that although Kotwar has given some identification details of the tenants to the police station but there are some more tenants whose details have not yet been registered.

Regarding the traffic management TI informed that arrangement of traffic police couldn't be made in Mana basti Village.

Feedback by CLG members: The CLG members understand the problem of lack of traffic police and not pursued it more and instead ask for 1-2 more traffic stopper which when placed would decrease the speed of the vehicle crossing the Village.

## **Problems raised by CLG members and the Police's response to it: -**

**Common Problem:** All the CLG members asked the police to keep check on the gambling and illegal sale of liquor that generally increases around diwali vacations.

*Police response:* T.I instructed all the Beat officer and patrolling party to start surveillance in all the Villages in order to check any gambling & sale of illegal liquor activities.

### ***Boriakalla Village:***

The CLG members of Boriakalla Village informed that notorious activity has been again started by the people sitting at Gandhi square 'Chowk' where they also intake liquor in the snacks stall 'thela'.

*Police response:* The T.I ask the beat officer to check that square while patrolling and also to keep surveillance over the stall so that no liquor could be consumed there

**Dhaneli Village:** The women CLG members of Dhaneli Village informed that although the sale of illegal liquor in their Village has came down, but the same accused is now selling to only those whom he personally knows.

*Police response:* The T.I. instructed the police officer to made raid over the accused house and take action to stop it.

**Mana Basti Village:** The CLG members asked the T.I to place 1 or 2 more traffic stoppers in the National Highway road crossing the Village.

*Police response:* T.I. agreed to their demand but informed that since they don't have big 4-wheeler to transport the traffic stopper and hence requested the CLG members to arrange some vehicle to carry the stopper lying in the police station (earlier the stopper was not free as it was used as stopper in the Police Station premises after the CM plantation programme in order to save the smaller plants from animal, but now a permanent entrance gate have been made).

CLG members asked the status of the proposed Police Help Center of Mana (Outpost).

*Police response:* T.I. informed that the CSP Mr. G. S. Bamra was looking after that matter and talks were going on with Shadani Darbar administration, but now as the CSP got transferred so now this matter is pending.

### **Expectations of Police from CLG members:-**

T.I. asked the CLG members to keep informed the police about the suspected and notorious activities in there area, and also told them that they should first know the facts & legal aspects before drawing out any conclusion regarding any action by police and should not create a view from a biased mindset.

### **Comments:**

This was the one of the very few T.I. meetings where the T.I. Mr. Dubey chaired the SHO-CLG meeting alone.

In this meeting the women participation was commendable as some women's CLG members from Dhaneli Village not only raised the problems of Village but also gave suggestions.

There was dilemma regarding the Police Help Center (Outpost) after the transfer of CSP Mr. G.S. Bamra who had initiated steps for setting up an outpost at Shadani Darbar campus.

The Consensus was lacking among the CLG on the proposed action over the gambling activity by the Villagers during the Diwali festival as most of them were saying that action should be made over the people indulge in gambling while some where of the view that people should be allowed to play card gambling during the diwali celebrations as it is a part of their culture. But the T.I. said that if police will not make action over gambling then they will be blamed for it later and other charges might be framed against them. The TI informed of strict action over gambling during the Diwali.
