Background information.

- 1886-1919: German rule
 - No formal police force
 - Use of local systems Jumbes and Akidas
- 1919- 1961: British rule
 - 1919; Police Force and Prisons Proclamation

Background information (cont...)

- Police Force was separated from Military
- 1953; Police force Ordinance Cap. 322

Independence Era

- No major changes except personnel
- Same approach and mandate adopted
- 1964; Union of Tanganyika and Zanzibar
 - + Police became a Union Matter
 - + Post of IGP
 - + Police Ordinance applicable in the Republic

Legal framework

- ➤ The URT Constitution 1977
 - provides for Executive Organ
 - Does not define Police

- ➤ Police Force Ordinance 1953
 - Establishes police force and its functions
 - defines posts and activities of Police

Legal framework (cont...)

- ➤ Police Force Service Regulations 1995
 - Staff regulations and code of conduct

- > Police general Orders
 - Daily operations of Police force

Other legislations

- > Penal Code 1945 Cap.16
 - Applicable to Police officers too.
- Criminal Procedure Act 1985
 - Arrest, interrogations, and prosecutions
- > Evidence Act 1967
 - Admissibility of evidence in Courts
- Prevention Of Terrorism Act 2002
 - It Overrides other legislations

Current situation (a) Police Experience

- □ Workload
 - 2003; TZ 1: 1400
 - UN 1: 450
- □ Remuneration
 - 2003 Police Constable \$ 80 p.m
- □ Living Condition
 - Lack of Shelter, access to water and toilets
- □ Lack of facilities
 - Difficult and dangerous Condition

(b) Public Experience

- Illegal Arrest and Extra Judicial killings
 - detention without trial
- ☐ Torture and Excessive use of Force
 - 17 detainees suffocated to death in 2002
- □ Corruption
 - -Warioba Commission
- □ Partiality
 - Denial of Permission to Opposition Parties
- ☐ Abuse of due process
 - Denial of Bail

Accountability

- > Internal discipline
 - senior Officers; PS of Ministry Responsible and President
 - Junior Officer IGP and Police force and Prisons Commission
 - Performance Monitoring
 - Complaints lodging to senior officer

External accountability

- > Parliament
 - Parliamentary Committee
 - Question time in the Parliament
- Legal Proceedings
 - Private prosecution
 - Suits against government

External accountability

- > Judiciary
 - -Judicial Review of Administrative Powers
- Commission of Human Rights and Good Governance
 - Toothless and people are loosing confidence on it.

External accountability

- ➤ Civil Societies
 - Monitoring HR violations
 - Systematic reforms of the Police Force
- > Media
 - Watchdog role of the police performance
 - Culture of secrecy and information protection

Political Control of Police Force

- □ Presidential Powers
 - Direct command of the Force
 - -Power to hire and fire IGP and senior officers
 - No security of tenure of IGP
 - Discretion under Emergence powers Act 1986.

Political Control of Police Force

- □ Ministerial Powers
 - power to give order to Police Force ignore the Advisory Committee.
- □ Police and Elections
 - Violence and suppression of Opposition Parties Activities
 - Eg; Operation Dondola in Zanzibar; Ngangari vs
 Ngunguri

State of Reform

- Legal sector reform Programme
 - ❖ Medium Term strategy 2004- 2007;
 - -national legal framework
 - promotion of transparency and accountability
 - unified prosecution system under DPP
 - improved access to justice for the poor and disadvantaged (police training)
 - Human rights and administrative justice
 - Professional legal knowledge(review of Police training curriculum)
 - service delivery capacity in key legal sector institutions (reduced congestion in custody, increase of personnel, adequacy of office space and detention facilities, accommodation and transport facilities.

State of Reform (cont...)

- Poverty Reduction strategy paper 2000
 - Sets criteria for allocation of funds
 - Priority areas include Judiciary, Police, Prisons, AGs Office, Law reform Commission and Commission of Human rights
 - ❖ 2003/04 Budget; substancial increase of budget to Judiciary and Police.
- Community Policing
 - Currently not in place
 - Partnership between Police force and Community

Opportunities for Reform

- Legislative reforms
 - Democratic principles of policing
 - Best practice of internal and external accountability mechanism
 - Conformity to International legal obligation
 - Good governance
 - The right to information

Opportunities for Reform(cont...)

- Independence of senior leadership
 - Presdential control to be checked and balanced
- Budget increase
 - Recruitment of more officers
 - Adequate resources
 - Imrovement of working conditions
 - Reasonable pay, housing and medical treatment to consumerate the risk inherent in their job.

Opportunities for Reform (cont..)

- Political Will and defined roles
 - Lack of genuine political will can be an obstacle to reforms
 - Shift from accountability from regime to community needs.
