

**Audit Report under section 12A(b) of the Income Tax Act, 1961**

We have examined the consolidated balance sheet of Commonwealth Human Rights Initiative as at 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2022 and the income and expenditure account for the year ended on that date which are in agreement with the books of account maintained by the said Society.

We have obtained all the information and explanations which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purposes of the audit. In our opinion, proper books of account have been kept by the Head Office of the above named Society visited by us so far as appears from our examination of the books, and proper returns adequate for the purposes of audit have been received from branches/offices not visited by us subject to the comments given below :

1. The FCRA Registration has been cancelled by the Ministry of Home Affairs, Foreigners Division (Monitoring Unit), Government of India vide order dated 19.04.2022
2. The Society has utilized Indian Contribution Funds for the purpose of Foreign Contribution expenses and has thus mixed up the funds.
3. The Society has utilized the funds of one project grant towards expenses of another project grant.
4. Separate books of account have not been kept and maintained for Consultancy Income and Expenditure

In our opinion and to the best of our information, and according to the explanations given to us, the said accounts give a true and fair view:-

- (i) in the case of the balance sheet, of the state of affairs of the above named Society as at 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2022 and
- (ii) in the case of the income and expenditure account, of the deficit of its accounting year ending on 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2022.

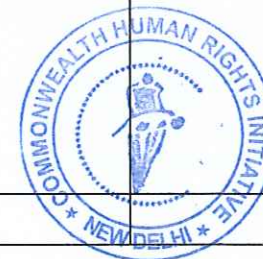
